

The pamphlets are arranged chronologically according to the year in which they were published. If the year is not given (as is the case with many pamphlets) they are dated on internal evidence.

Reprints are usually entered under the date of the first edition, unless there was a special reason for publication in the year of the reprint. Titles of reprints immediately following an earlier edition are not usually repeated in full, but abridged with the aid of three dots (...) and connected with the preceding one by the indication "enz. (als het voorgaande)" (= etc. (as the preceding one)). Often, one or more points of difference are mentioned. This does not mean, however, that no other differences can occur in the part(s) of the title not quoted.

Per annum, titles have been subdivided into broad categories as foreign and domestic affairs, religious disputes etc. These are indicated in the upper margin.

Each volume concludes with an alphabetical register of authors; an alphabetical subject register for *all* volumes can be found in the last volume.

In the Old Book Department of the Koninklijke Bibliotheek (Royal Library), an interleaved copy of the catalogue is kept which contains corrections and additions of several kinds. As far as these corrections and additions concern other copies or editions of pamphlets already recorded in the catalogue, they have been taken over into the volumes from which this reprint has been made. The additions are listed as "2e ex." (= 2nd copy) or "andere uitg[ave]" (= other edition). If it cannot be ascertained from the notes in the interleaved copy which is applicable, the additions are then entered as "variant". When "other editions" and "variants" are recorded, a point of difference with a title already in existence is given if possible.

Also indicated is which titles have been removed from their place in the catalogue to another date; mention is made of the correct number. There are also references in the main catalogue to titles in the supplement.

The catalogue number also functions as shelf number in the pamphlet collection of the Royal Library. In the few cases in which this is no longer valid, they are specifically marked by giving their present shelf number. This

applies particularly to manuscript pamphlets, which have been transferred to the Manuscripts Department (indicated as “= *hs...*”).
