Professor Alan F BANCE, BA (London), PhD (Cantab.). Head of German Section, School of Modern Languages at the University of Southampton. President of the Conference of University Teachers of German in Great Britain and Ireland. Has published widely, mostly on twentieth century German literature, war themes and the role of the intellectual in society.

Clive EDWARDS, BA, MA (Wales). Lecturer in German at the University of Bath. Has published mainly on trade unions and labour relations in German industry.
