The Manuscript

Lambeth Palace Library, London. Ms. 178.

Contains Mocket's own treatise, *Disciplina et Politeia* in a form anterior to those of the printed editions, with a signed dedication to Archbishop Abbot. Leaves numbered by hand in modern times, 93–135; 135 [bis] –138.

The Printed Edition, London, 1616

A⁸ (2, 3 signed; B⁸–Z⁸ first 4 leaves signed). 350 pages numbered 1–349, but page 319 misnumbered 419; blank pages between works are not numbered but count in the succession; + one large folded *Table of Affinity*, bound at the end of the copy reproduced but when present in other copies sometimes bound elsewhere).

The Reissue, dated 1617

With the prelims reset (A⁸ becoming A⁴) and V⁸–Z⁸ reset with emended and altered text. Pagination as in 1616, the misnumbered page 319 not being in a reset quire.

London, British Library: at 490. b. 33. Copy given by Henry Hyde to his brother Edward, as Henry lay under sentence of death in the Tower. It bears a dedication to Henry's memory, dated *Call. Mart. 1650/1*.

Cambridge University Library: at Syn. 61.35 (formerly 7.22.61). *Table of Affinity* bound before page 1.

Cambridge University Library: at Bb. 4. 222–D. Signature of Ch. Potter. *Table of Affinity* placed between pp. 348 and 349. Bound with a copy of the "Articles of Religion, 1562". Copious manuscript notes (1) : leaf bound before p. 1 "BY THE KING. A Proclamation declaring that the proceedings of his Majesties Ecclesiastical Courts and Ministers are according to the Lawes of the Realme." dated at end, "Given at the Court at Lyndhurst, 18 Aug. 13^o Car. Rex." (2): At back of book, a leaf numbered 301 (for 355) containing a "Confession of the Church", printed December 1628. (3): "A Proclamation for the suppressing of a Book entitled *Appello Caesarem*" [by Richard Montague, Bishop of Chichester, printed 1525], dated "Whitehall, Jan 17. 4^o regni Caroli. 4^o:" p. 355, stuck on to a larger leaf, an "Order of the House of Parliament, Thurs. Jan. 29. 1628."

These mss notes are not directly concerned with Mocket or his book, but with the authority of King over Church. The prayers from the Latin version of the Jacobean Book of Common Prayer are brought up to date by hand, replacing James and Anna by Charles and Maria. Such changes may imply that at least this copy of the *Liber Precum Publicarum* was used for worship, perhaps in Church or Chapel.

Copy of George Abbot, Archbishop of Canterbury; original binding with archiepiscopal arms of Abbot, perhaps with more modern gilding; at end of volume signature of "G: Cant:" with blotted out note alluding to the censuring of what it calls "*Politia Ecclesiae Anglicanae*". Copy formerly in the library of John Scot, C. B., of Halkshill, Largs, Ayrshire; sold by Sotheby's on 1 April, 1905 for four pounds ten shillings. Purchased from London, in late 1923 or early 1924, for nine guineas by the Honorable Henry White; given to Washington National Cathedral Library, 7 December, 1924, by the purchaser.

After 1662, written in the margins, in more than one hand, several new Latin prayers and several new alterations to the Jacobean Prayer-Book taken from the newly revised 1662 *Book of Common Prayer*, with other Latin prayers for the time of Communion written on the rear flyleaf. These additions and corrections strongly suggest that this copy was used for at least private worship.
