CHISTIAKOV, Nikolai Fedorovich. Candidate of legal sciences, senior staff member of the Institute of State and Law of the USSR Academy of Sciences, specialist in the field of criminal and court procedure, author of about 160 publications on questions of legality, court procedure, etc.

CLARK, Roger S. Distinguished Professor, Law School, Rutgers University, Camden; Member, United Nations Committee on Crime Prevention and Control.

GINSBURGS, George. Distinguished Professor, Law School, Rutgers University, Camden.

KUDRIAVTSEV, Vladimir Nikolaevich. Doctor of legal sciences, Professor, acting member of the Academy of Sciences of the USSR since 1984, Vice-President of the USSR Academy of Sciences since 1988, Director of the Institute of State and Law of the USSR Academy of Sciences since 1973. Author of more than 250 scholarly works on questions of criminology, criminal law, sociology of law. He is sole author of the monographs: *Causes of Violations of the Law*, 1976; *Law and Behavior*, 1978; *Legal Behavior: Norm and Pathology*, 1982. Five of his works have been translated into foreign languages and published abroad. He is one of the initiators and leaders of sociological research in the field of law in the USSR. Member of the Presidium of the Soviet Committee for the Defense of Peace, Vice-President of the Association of Soviet Jurists; Vice-President of the International Society for Social Defense, member of the executive council of the International Association of Criminal Law. In 1979, he was elected foreign member of the Hungarian Academy of Sciences, and in 1984 of the Bulgarian Academy of Sciences.

LARIN, Aleksandr Mikhailovich. Doctor of legal sciences, directing staff member of the Institute of State and Law of the USSR Academy of Sciences, author of more than 150 works on questions of criminal procedure, including a major monograph "Investigation in a Criminal Case; Procedural Functions," 1986, Legal Literature Publishing House.

LEDIAKH, Irina Andreevna. Candidate of legal sciences, senior staff member of the Institute of State and Law of the USSR Academy of Sciences, author of no less than 200 scholarly publications on questions of constitutional, criminal and comparative law. Among them, the monograph "Nazi War Criminals and the Court Practice of the Federal Republic of Germany," 1973, "Nauka," Moscow.

LUKASHUK, Igor Ivanovich. Professor, doctor of legal sciences, directing staff member of the Institute of State and Law of the USSR Academy of Sciences, author of more than 200 works on the general theory of international law, the law of international treaties. Member of Soviet delegations to the United Nations and other international organs and organizations.

MURPHY, John F. Professor of Law at Villanova University. He has also taught at Cornell, Georgetown, the Naval War college, and the University of Kansas. He has been in the private practice of law and has also been an attorney with the office of the Legal Advisor of the U.S. Department of State. He is coeditor of and contributor to *Legal Aspects of International Terrorism* (Lexington Books, 1978) and author of *The United Nations and the Control of International Violence* (Allanheld, Osmun, 1982), *Punishing International Terrorists* (Rowman & Allanheld, 1985), *State Support of International Terrorism* (Westview, 1989) and (with Alan Swan) *International Business and Economic Relations* (Matthew, Bender), forthcoming.

POMORSKI, Stanisław. Distinguished Professor, Law School, Rutgers University, Camden.

RESHETOV, Iurii Aleksandrovich. Doctor of legal sciences, head of Administration of International Humanitarian Cooperation and Human Rights of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the USSR, author of around 100 works mainly on human rights and problems of international law; expert consultant to the Committee on the liquidation of racial discrimination founded on the basis of the International Convention on the liquidation of all forms of racial discrimination.

SIMONS, William B. Cole, Corette, and Abrutyn, Washington D.C. and London. Formerly Legal Research Officer, Documentation Office for East European Law, University of Leyden. Mr Simons continues to pursue his prior experience and interest in the field of Soviet legal studies and international and comparative law both through his current duties as corporate counsel as well as through participation in various symposia devoted to Soviet and international law and by contribution to publications in these areas.
