

NOTE ON BIBLIOGRAPHY

The publications of the Permanent Court of International Justice (P.C.I.J.) were organized in the following Series:

- A. Judgments and Orders. Nos. 1–24 (1922–30)
- B. Advisory opinions. Nos. 1–18 (1922–30).

These were amalgamated in 1931 to form

- A/B. Judgments, orders and advisory opinions. Nos. 40–80 (1931–40).
- C. Acts and Documents relating to judgments and advisory opinions (Pleadings). Nos. 1–19 (1922–30), 52–88 (1931–45).
- D. Acts and Documents concerning the organization of the Court. Nos. 1–6 (1922–40).
- E. Annual Reports. Nos. 1–16 (1925–45).
- F. General Indexes. Nos. 1–4 (1922–36).

The publications of the International Court of Justice (I.C.J.) are now organized as follows:

Reports of Judgments, Advisory Opinions and Orders (Rep.). Annual since 1948.

Pleadings, Oral Arguments, Documents (Pleadings). One or more volumes, containing the Court record, for each case.

Acts and Documents concerning the Organization of the Court (Acts). Two volumes to date (1946, 1972), containing the basic texts relating to the Court, including the Rules of Court.

Yearbook. Yearbook of the International Court of Justice, covering the period 16 July–15 July. Annual since 1946–47.

The Bibliography of the International Court of Justice. Nos. 1–18 formed Chapter IX of the *Yearbook* up to the 1963–64 edition. Beginning with No. 19 the *Bibliography* has been issued annually as a separate fascicle, arranged so as to facilitate the binding of several numbers together.

All the above are in bilingual editions except Series E and the *Yearbook* (*Annuaire*), which are published in separate English and French editions.

Since 1968 the annual *Report of the International Court of Justice*, covering the period 1 August–31 July, has been published as a Supplement to the *Official Records of the General Assembly*. It is available in the official languages of the General Assembly.

The abbreviation R.A.D.I. used in the Notes refers to the *Recueil des Cours* of the Academy of International Law, which is also situated in the Peace Palace at The Hague. The abbreviation O.R. refers to the *Official Records* of the various organs of the United Nations.
