Introduction

As Taine has remarked, history is made by men, and so the historian's first task is to assess the quirks and singularities of his actors; to vary the familiar cleri-hew, "Geography is about Maps, But Historiography is about Chaps". To most working historians, this statement must seem the stuff of primers; like many rudimentary principles, however, it is most often honoured in the breach. The tendency towards a certain schematism seems particularly marked in the writing of Russian history in recent decades. It is not mysterious that this should be so in Soviet historiography: there, the question of "the rôle of the individual in the historical process" has been solved in a manner which cannot but affect the historian's exploration of human variety. It is less easy, however, to explain this phenomenon in western writings on Russia. Perhaps the original influence of Cold War motives on the expansion of Russian studies has left a residual tendency to try to "explain" the Russians; certainly many strangers to the field feel that this must be why one is occupied with it. Perhaps it is simply part of a broader trend: a seeming envy, among humanists, of the authoritative statements of the exact sciences, which leads to a fruitless imitation of their techniques of generalization. In any case, whether or not one agrees with this view, it would be hard to deny that the historiography of Russia could do with a few more recognisable human figures, with those specific and unrepeatable individuals whose representation makes the difference between the blueprint and the portrait of a period. For this task, the natural material is a rich legacy of printed memoirs, diaries, and letters, from which a small, but (we hope) alluring selection is presented here.

The primary limit within which this selection has been made is one of number: it was considered advisable to present no more than some fifty authors or collections of materials, until the interest of libraries and individual scholars in such a list should become apparent. If the response warrants it, an expanded supplement to this list will be issued later. The limitation of number has inescapably stringent effects. By the nature of the material, there is no scientific principle which can be applied to the collection of personal sources - the only guarantee of usefulness is completeness (and, to be sure, sensible arrangement of the material). The standard collection of this sort, Mintslov's *Obzor zapisok, dnevnikov, vospominanii, pisem i puteshestvii, otnosiashchikhsia k istorii Rossii i napechatannykh na russkom iazyke*, vyp. 1-3, Novgorod, 1911-1912, presents more than three thousand entries for the nineteenth century,

and is notoriously incomplete; the projected revision of Mintslov which has been undertaken by a collective of Soviet scholars is expected to run to at least three thick tomes, of which a major portion will be devoted to the nineteenth century. The present selection, then, must be seen as a sort of *zakuska*, designed to compensate by the rarity and flavoursomeness of its ingredients for the lost satisfactions of a larger repast.

Several groups of memoir materials have been excluded out of hand. The first of these is materials relating to professional revolutionaries, which will not appear in any possible supplement to this list. The main reason for this is the sheer mass of writings in this field, which demands a separate list of its own. An additional consideration is the fact that a disproportionate amount of attention has been devoted to these figures already: one can almost forget that the great majority of Russians of the past century either defended the existing system, or merely accepted it, or were willing to try changing it within the framework of its rules. It is this side of Russian society, what one writer has called *legal'nata obshchestvennost'*, which is represented here in various incarnations. Temporarily excluded are actors, painters and musicians, and the members of the Royal Family; if the response justifies it, some of their writings - admittedly necessary to any rounded picture of Russian society - will be added in the future. Every specialist will have favourites which have been omitted here, either by inadvertence or design; it can only be hoped that he will see here interesting and possibly unfamiliar items which will make up for the omissions.

All the works listed are difficult to obtain. Some were printed in very limited editions, for instance, the *Arkhiv Raevskikh* (600 copies). Some, like the memoirs of Veniukov or the seventh *vypusk* of the *Arkhiv brat'ev Turgenevykh*, are extremely rare for reasons which it has not been possible to discover, and are held in complete form only by the great libraries of Leningrad and Moscow. Some, like the publications of the late 1920's and early 1930's, appeared in printings of several thousand copies, but have become rare due to particular historical circumstances. At any rate, no Western library or individual scholar is likely to have them all, and it is hoped that this offering will help to fill such gaps.

The titles are arranged in alphabetical order, without a division by types of activity; this is a manageable principle with so small a list, and with relatively few exceptions, the figures included here were prominent in more than one

field of activity, so that pigeon-holing them by professional attributes would tend to obscure rather than to underline their interest. The annotations include the dates of birth and death of the central figures of each publication, and where the range of coverage is more narrowly restricted in time, this is indicated. Some additional material is adduced in each citation, not with any pretence at proper bio-bibliographical treatment, but simply to give some idea of the main points of interest in each of these publications (in some cases of the particular individuals discussed by the author), and to remind the reader, where he may have forgotten them, of some of the interesting Russians of the past century.

Publicist, poet, newspaper editor. Trained as jurist, served in Governing Senate, Ministry of Internal Affairs to retirement in 1852, volunteer in Crimean War. Key figure in evolution of Pan-Slavism.

Pioneer of Sunday-school movement from early 1860's (Khar'kov). Coverage of 1870's-1890's; Turgenev, Dostoevsky, Tolstoy, G.I. Uspenskii, etc.

This collection constitutes one of the best published sources for the background of the Decembrist movement, and for the general temper of educated Russian society in the Alexandrine epoch.
