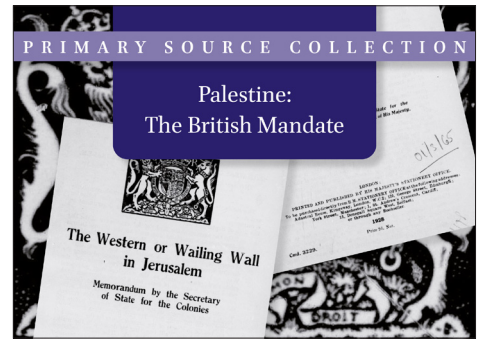


# Palestine: The British Mandate

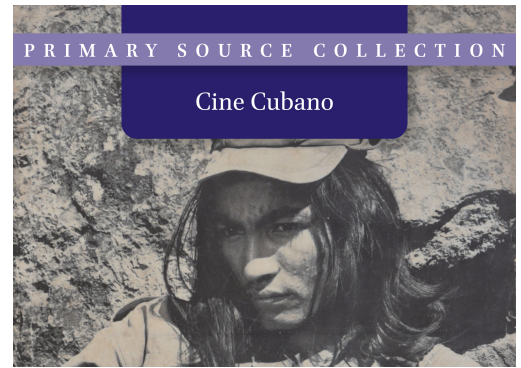

The journal *Cine Cubano* is an essential resource for studying the rich history of both Cuban revolutionary cinema and Latin American cinema at large, and is now made available online for the first time. The more than two hundred digital issues offer students and researchers unparalleled access to six decades of cutting-edge film theory, novel approaches to film making, and scores of film reviews.

In June 1960, less than nineteen months after the establishment of Cuba's revolutionary government, the first issue of *Cine Cubano* was published. Despite the turbulent times, it had a print-run of 20,000 copies and was launched as a monthly. The cover featured a photograph of 'Rebeldes,' the second episode of the movie *Historias de la Revolución*, which at the time was yet to be released. The new journal would become the longest ongoing film magazine of Latin America and continues to be published until today. *Cine Cubano* is the official organ of the Cuban Institute of Cinematographic Art and Industry (ICAIC). Enacted by law on March 24, 1959, ICAIC was the first cultural body founded by the new government. With its clear desire for rupture, the institute needed a medium to disseminate its ideas.

More than sixty years have passed and *Cine Cubano* remains the longest-lived specialized film publication in Latin America. Its mission of integrating all the arts and give voice to the new Latin American cinema, a movement that was bursting with force, led the magazine at times to publish single-themed issues and, at other times, to ignore cinema altogether in favor of other art forms, such as the plastic arts.

In 2020, the journal switched from a print to an online format. The present collection includes all 205 issues that have ever been published in print (1960–2019).

# Cuban Culture and Cultural Relations, 1959-

Accumulated over six decades, the Music section in the so-called 'vertical archive' at Casa de las Américas documents musical developments in both Cuba, the Caribbean, and Latin America. In addition, it covers some European countries. This unique collection comprises 1,163 folders with various types of documents—press clippings, telexes, brochures, event programs, catalogs, photographs, etc. Both popular and academic events are documented, for instance in the form of concert announcements, reviews, and interviews.

The archive deals with a wide range of themes: musical personalities (performers, composers, directors, groups), festivals and events, musical genres, conferences, etc. The folders are organized by country; within the folders, documents are stored chronologically. Each folder gives access to documents about notable persons in the Cuban and Latin American cultural scene, music and musicology events in Cuba, and events taking place in Latin America between the 1960s and the present day. Within Latin America, especially Mexico, Chile, Brazil, Peru, Venezuela, and Puerto Rico are well represented.

The files about the 1960s, '70s and '80s are particularly noteworthy, since they allow researchers to track ground-breaking musical developments, such as the emergence of musical avant-gardes on the Continent, the Protest Song, the New Latin American Song (*nueva canción*) and the Cuban *nueva trova*. The archive is also rich on international musical events, including for instance the Latin American Contemporary Music Festival, the Caribbean Song Festival, Mexico's Cervantino Festival, Chile's Viña del Mar Song Festival, and the Teresa Carreño International Piano Competition in Miami.

Cuba, of course, is well covered, especially when it comes to events organized by Casa de las Américas. Extensive information is available on the 1967 Protest Song conference, the 1972 Latin American Music conference, the 1978 Guitarists from Latin America and the Caribbean conference, the 1983 Tango Yesterday and Today conference, and the 1997 Songs of the Rose and the Thorn conference. Of course, documentation about the music prizes awarded by Casa de las Américas for composition and musicology are not lacking.

Finally, scholars and students exploring the archive will find themselves rewarded with unparalleled records about all the great musicians who over the decades have performed in Cuba's concert halls.

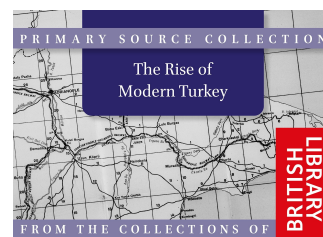
**The Creation of Modern Iraq, c. 1914-1921**

*Jacoby Online* is a digital edition of fragments and testimonia of Greek historians, and other authors from antiquity. Although the works of these historians are now lost, we still have passages in the form of citations and paraphrases in ancient texts that are preserved.

*Jacoby Online* is anchored in the work of Felix Jacoby, who started the work of collecting fragments and writing commentaries. To his *Die Fragmente der Griechischen Historiker I-III* (1923-1959) are added two new editions, *Brill's New Jacoby* (2006-2023) and *Brill's New Jacoby - Second Edition* (2016-), both edited by Ian Worthington. Felix Jacoby himself was unable to finish the collection, but in the 1990s, the work on *Die Fragmente der Griechischen Historiker* resumed, resulting in *FGrHist Part IV*, currently edited by Stefan Schorn, and *FGrHist Part V*, currently edited by Hans-Joachim Gehrke and Felix Maier.

Together, these editions form a monumental scholarly accomplishment and an indispensable resource for anyone interested in ancient history and historiography.

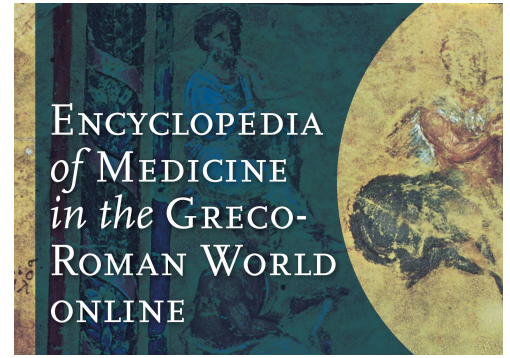

It includes references to his typographical material, his correspondence, and the Plantin archive in Antwerp, as well as links to digital reproductions. Based on the printed edition compiled by Léon Voet in collaboration with Jenny Voet-Grisolle (Amsterdam, 1980–1983), this open-access research tool incorporates the latest bibliographical findings as well as corrections to the print edition. The dataset is continuously updated and complemented by specialists at the Museum Plantin-Moretus in Antwerp. We are embedding citizen science, which means we invite users to provide any additional information that would improve this bibliography.

This digital resource is published in collaboration with Museum Plantin-Moretus.

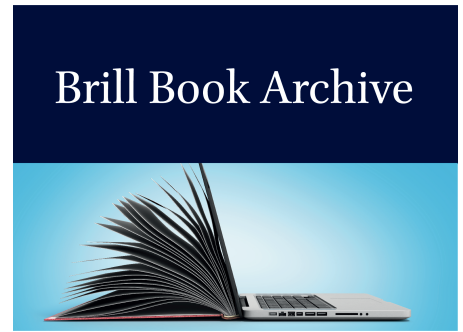
