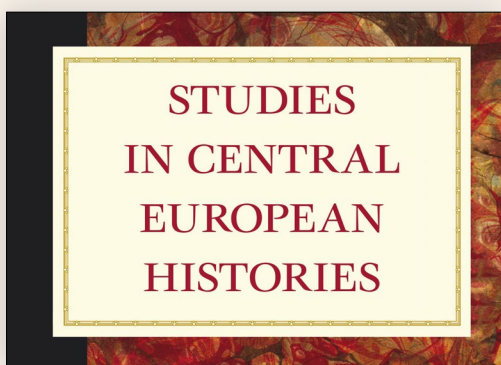
History of Warfare Online

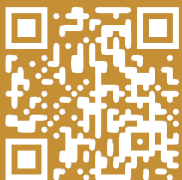

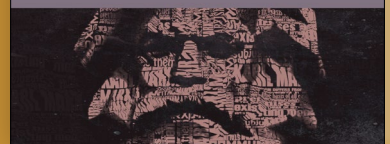
