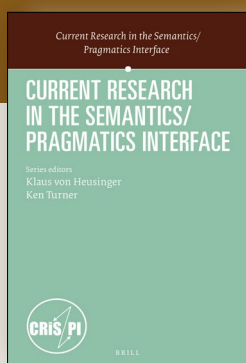

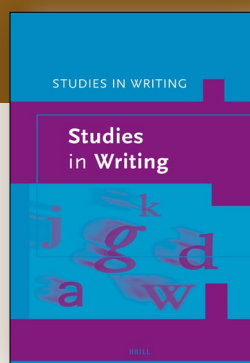

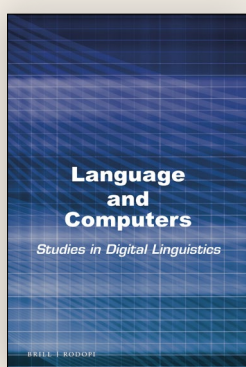
Current Research in the Semantics / Pragmatics Interface

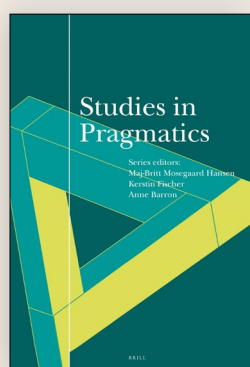
Studies in Writing

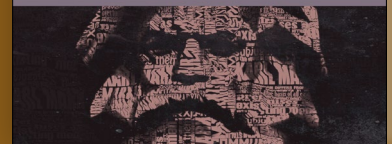
